


CORE CONCEPT/CONSTRUCT

The model is centred around bringing together community and government stakeholders to jointly own, plan, and implement projects addressing local issues.

- Fostering collaboration between stakeholders.
- Promoting visible behavioural changes.
- Creating an enabling environment for socio-economic development

Model Elements



Situational Analysis: A contextual understanding of locality: Data Access, Local Issues, Attitudes, Priorities, Relationships – all providing local stakeholders with better understanding of their local complexity to enable good thinking and appropriate planning.

Municipal Empowerment: A coherent municipality (political and administration)- authentically committed to radical collaboration, improved responsiveness to community centricity, improve performance and culture for transformation.

Community Stakeholder Empowerment: More structured, inclusive and organised a-political civil coalition committed to collaborate with the municipality to achieve the change they desire.

Stakeholder Mobilization: A sound inclusive governance environment that is community centric and geared to enabled to promote socio economic development.
